

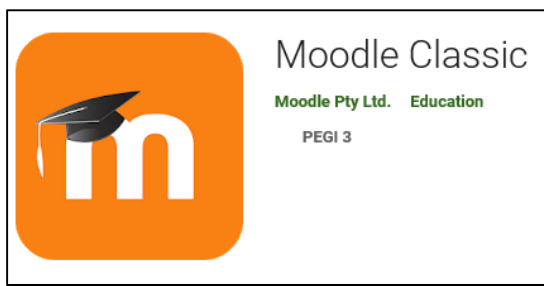
The Moodle Mobile App

1. Download the App


Our version of Moodle is compatible with the Moodle mobile app – available to download free for:

Android 
iPhone 
Windows 

Go to your App Store and search for the Moodle Classic app produced by Moodle Pty Ltd – use only this official one.



You will need to input the URL of our Moodle when you set up the app (<http://moodle.oldhamlll.org>) and then input your user name and password.

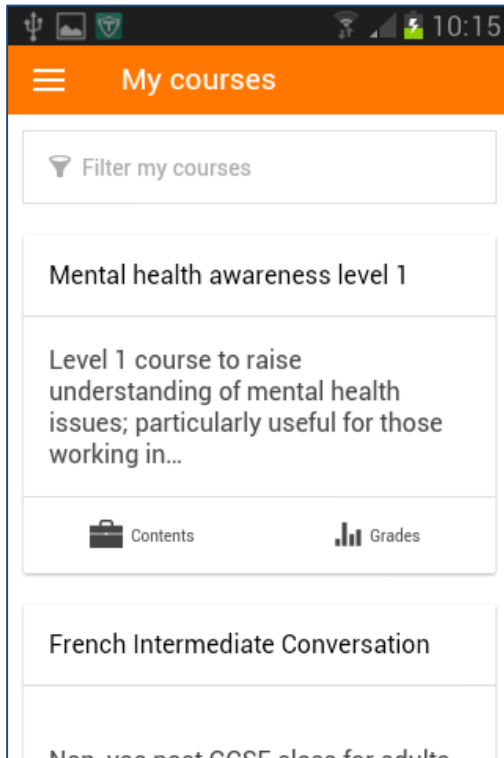

You will now remain logged in via your phone.

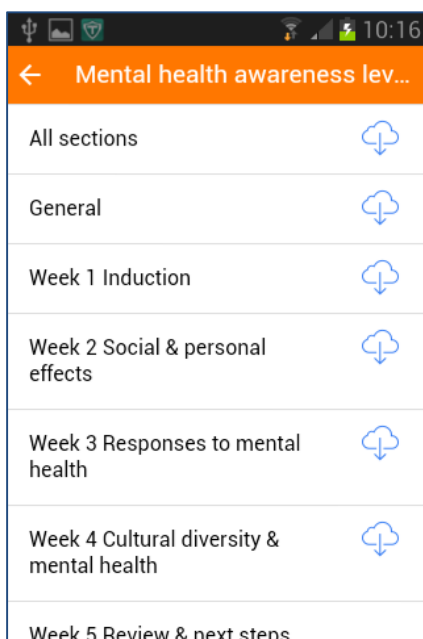
2. Browse your resources



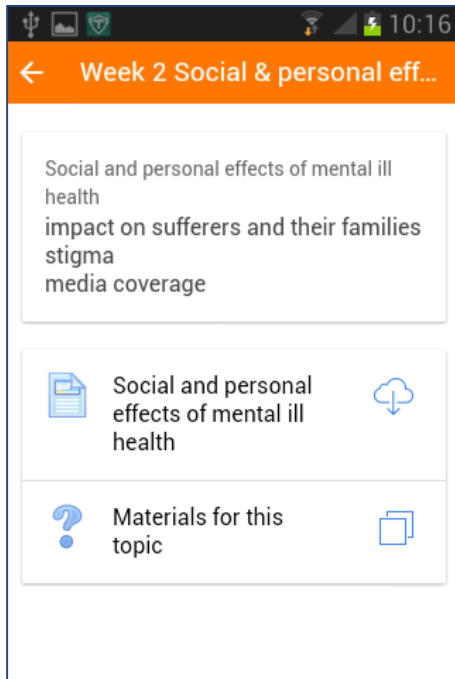
When you touch the icon on your phone the App will open and you will see the 'My courses' list. You can scroll down to find a specific area.



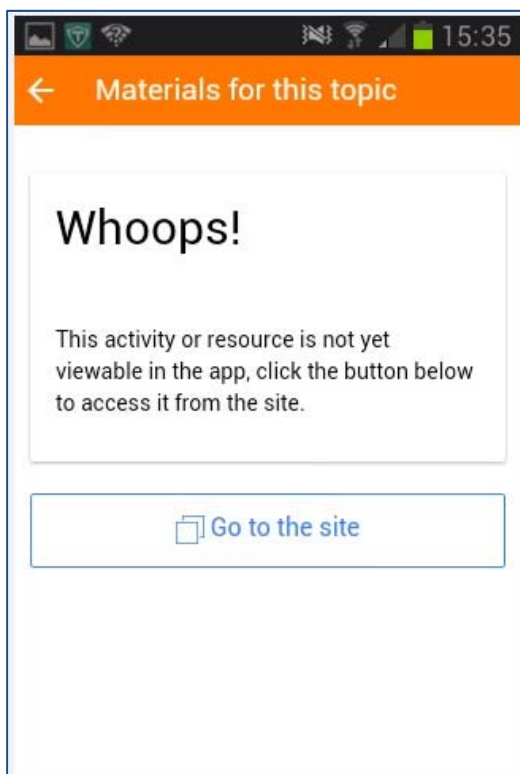
When you touch any course you will see a list of the topics, weeks or sections.



Touch the week or topic that interests you to see the resources available. I touched 'Week 2 Social & personal effects':



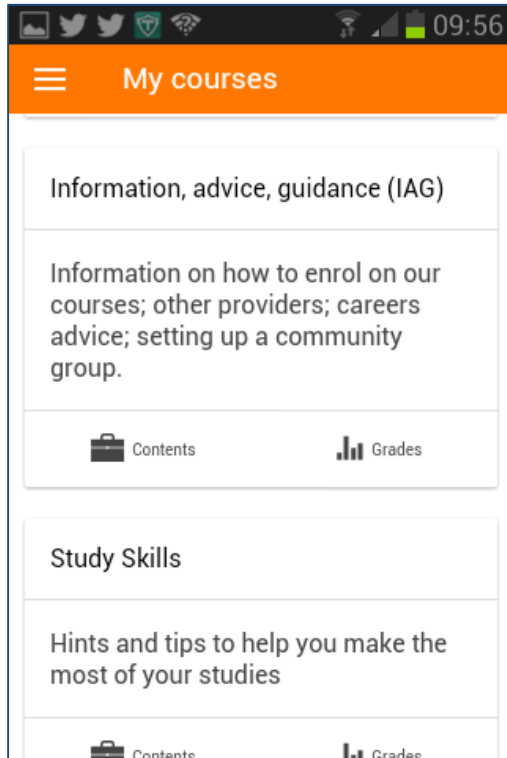
If any resource you select is not a PDF file or is a quiz or other type of activity, you will be directed to the Lifelong Learning Moodle website – i.e. outside of the App – and will have to log in.



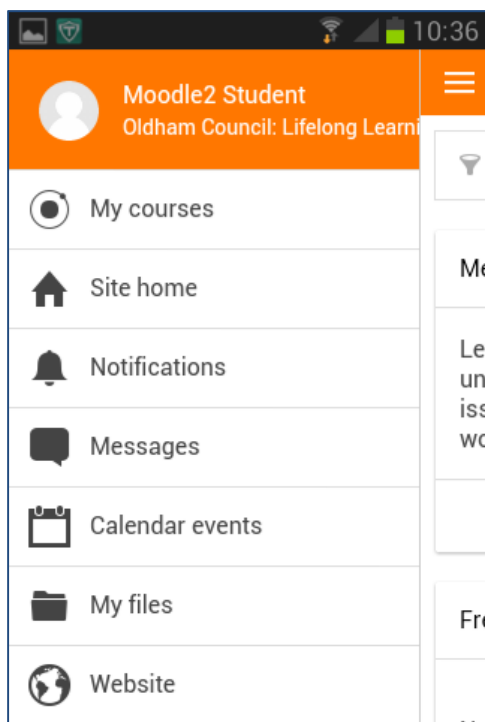


Touch the back icon to return to the list of topics or to your courses.

The general learner areas will be listed under your courses.




Touch the menu  to see other options.




3. Send messages and find contacts

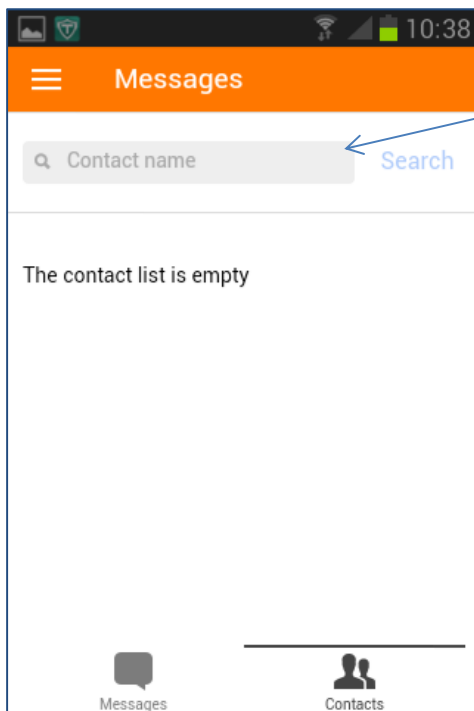
You can use the app to send messages to other registered users, e.g. your tutor and class colleagues.

Touch  Messages You will see a screen like the one below.



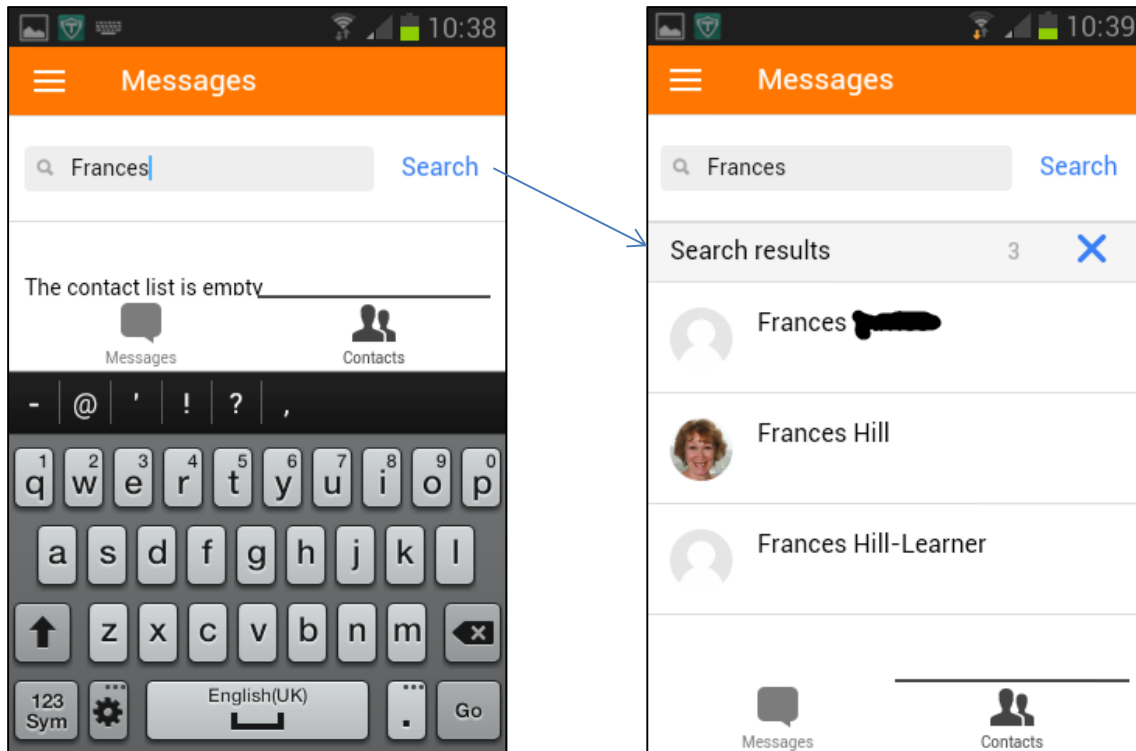
Touch  Contacts and you will see the search

facility.



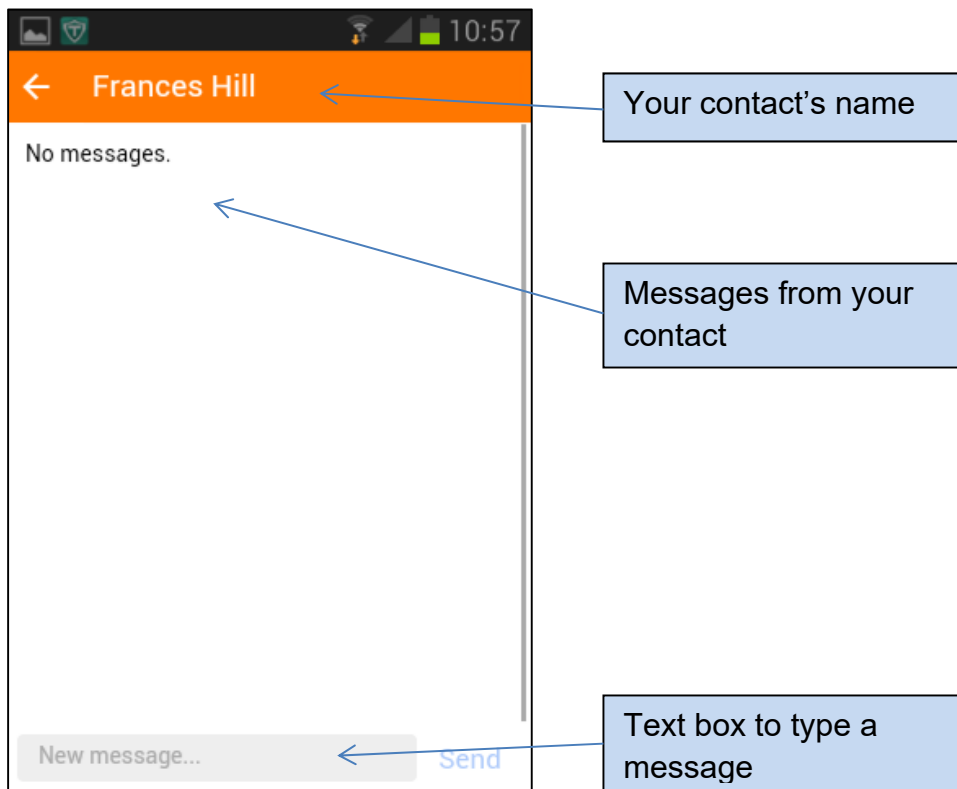
Input your search name here – you can use a first name, surname or partial name.

Touch the blue 'search'.

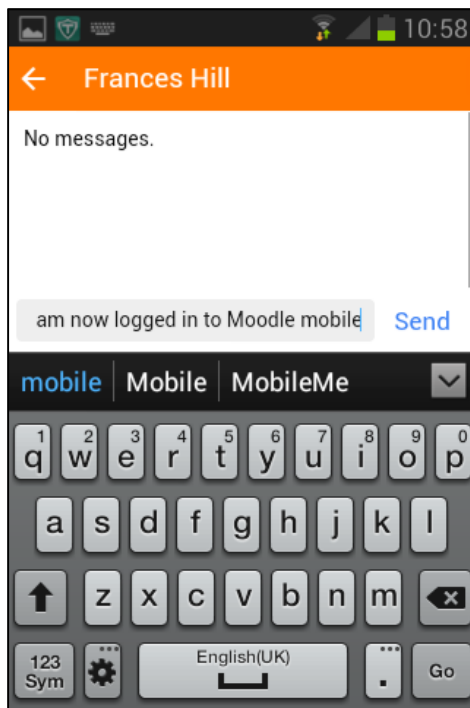


(There are 3 results from my search. I want the second person listed.)

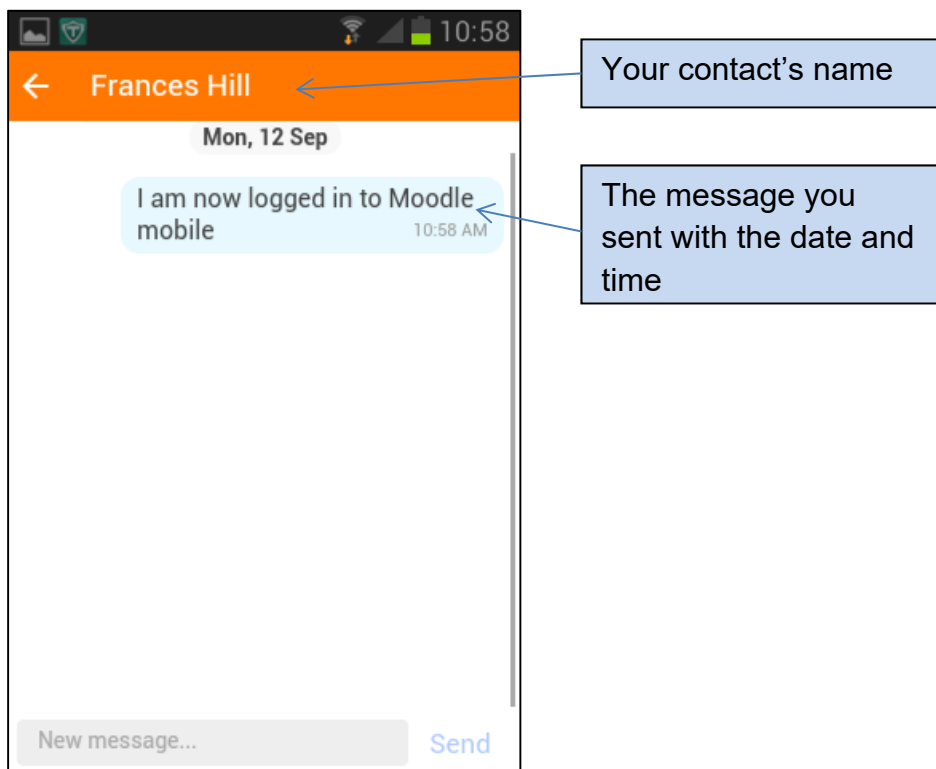
Touch the name of the contact you were looking for.



Type your message in the text box.



Touch **Send** and your message will be sent to your contact.

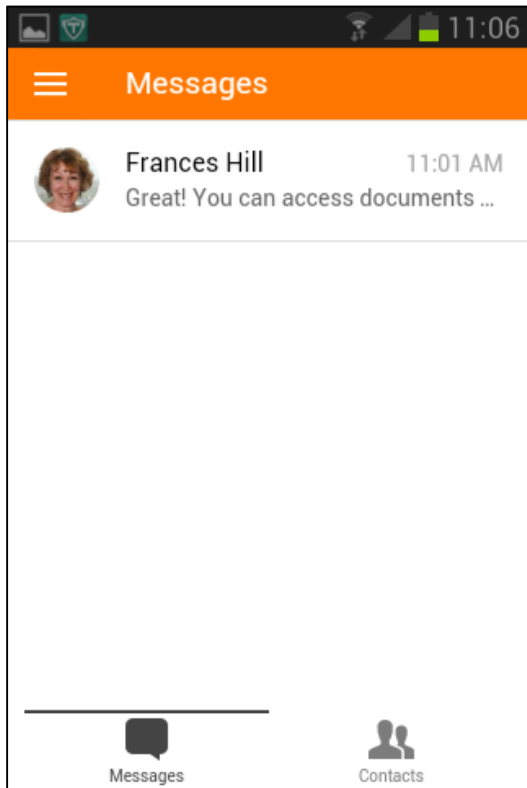


If they are not logged in to Moodle the message will go to their email inbox – your name will be shown as the sender but your email address will be listed as 'no-reply@moodle.olhamll.org'.

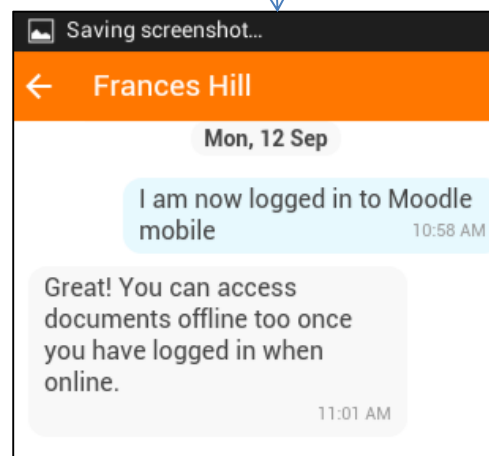
When you receive a message you will see it after touching



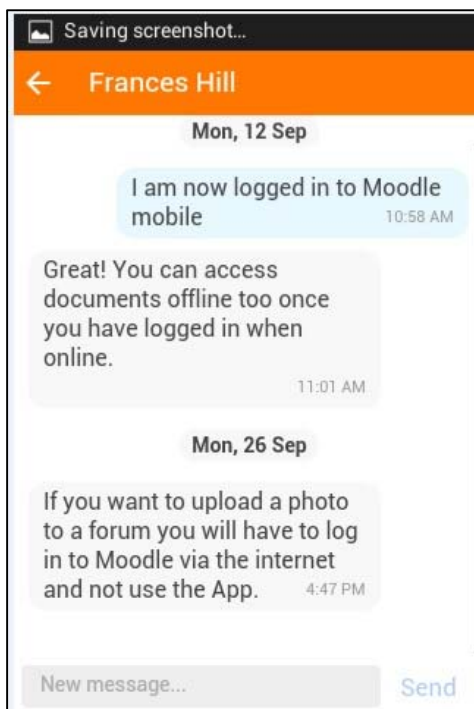
The message will open automatically.



Touch the text to reveal the whole message.
Any message you sent will also be shown.



Whenever you click on 'messages' you will see all recent messages listed.



Tip 1

Functionality is currently limited to browsing, downloading PDF resources and messaging but the App provides a quick and easy way to browse and find information quickly.

Once the app is installed and you have logged in, you can browse your cached version of Moodle when you are offline.

Tip 2

Ask your tutor to provide an 'app-friendly' course by ensuring that all or most of the uploaded resources are in PDF format. This will ensure you can browse resources without having to log in to Moodle outside of the App.

Tip 3

You will be sent notifications of holiday and half term dates via the App. If your tutor uses the Moodle calendar for important reminders these will be also be sent to the App.

Tip 4

If you use Moodle to upload assignments you will have to upload your files via the internet and not via the App.
